


THE MYSTERY AND MAGIC OF THE 'APPLEDORE MYRTLE'







His book based on his experiences was published in 1993 and became an instant bestseller. Since then McNab has written more than 30 books including 21 novels featuring ex-SAS officer Nick Stone. 
REV. FERGUS BUTLER-GALLIE: CONFESSIONS AND COMMUNIONS OF A YOUNG PRIEST




ALEXANDER LARMAN: THE WINDSORS AT WAR -THE NAZI THREAT TO THE CROWN





What happened in Appledore and Northam back in the 15th century? Not much, if the quantity of records is anything to go by. However, local historian **David Carter** recently discovered a couple of references to interesting events which give a unique view of life in the 1420s.

These events have echoes which can still be seen today, and one of them leads to an amazing 600th anniversary which is happening this year. David's presentations have been a part of the Appledore Book Festival for many years now, and this one certainly won't disappoint.
